	Why do I need it?

	What are the benefits to me or my baby?
	Are there any side-effects?
	Are there any risks to me or my baby?
	Do I have to have it?
	When will I get the results?
	What happens if the results of a test are positive?
	What happens if they are negative?
	What are the chances of the test result being wrong?
	Is there anything I need to do to prepare for the test?
	Do I need to do anything to care for myself after the test?
	Are there any costs involved?
	What support is available if something is wrong with my pregnancy?

Remember that it's your right to be fully informed about any tests or treatment you're asked to have and to refuse any tests or treatment you're offered.
