About this document

Improving health literacy

Health literacy is about how people understand health information, use it to make informed decisions, and how they act upon these decisions to manage their health and wellbeing.

The focus of the work we do is to empower people to manage their own health. We do this by ensuring we consistently have high standards of health information and advice that people can understand and use.

Why is health literacy important?

In Australia, it's estimated that 60% of people have less than adequate levels of health literacy, which is a significant challenge in delivering health services.

Low health literacy is a risk factor for poor health. It can affect people's ability to do things like navigate the health system, understand medical instructions, and seek support from health professionals. This can increase the risk of people needing emergency care, being hospitalised, mismanaging their medication and not understanding their disease or condition.

Low health literacy levels have also been shown to impact the safety and quality of healthcare and contribute to higher healthcare costs.



Culturally and linguistically diverse people in Australia

Australia is a multicultural country. Almost half of all Australians (45%) were either born overseas (6.2 million) or have at least one parent who was born overseas (4.5 million).¹

More than a fifth (21%) of Australian residents speak a language other than English at home. After English, the next most common languages spoken at home are Mandarin, Arabic, Cantonese and Vietnamese.
